For teachers to become familiar with the Australian Curriculum in History.

Teachers should be starting to provide opportunities for students to practise the historical skills and expose students to the historical knowledge and understandings (content). Teachers will be assessing and reporting using the achievement standards in 2015, so it is essential to enter the world of HISTORY now!

What does that mean for teachers at PCPS?

The following table provides a guideline of where to start when introducing the History curriculum to our students. Keep in mind that teachers are still accountable to teach and assess using the Curriculum Framework and K-10 Syllabus, in the area of *Society and Environment*. For links between the S&E and History curriculum, please see refer to the blue files in the History Box.

It is highly likely that some schools may start to assess and report using AC achievement standards before 2015.

Remember that AC content will begin to surface in 2014 NPALAN testing.
